In the 1990s, Mr. Umbach conducted several longer research stays in the U.S. (Washington DC, Fort Leavenworth, and Santa Monica) and Moscow, and received research grants from NATO and the Kennan-Institute for Advanced Russian Studies (Woodrow Wilson Center, Washington DC).
